#### **CURRENT SERIES: RESURRECTION REALITY**

St. Paul writes, "...in fact Christ has been raised from the dead" (1 Corinthians 15:20). Two important words: "in fact." Paul is stressing that the resurrection really happened. Easter is history. Jesus' resurrection is the event that defines reality for us all. If Christ had remained dead, he would be a fraud and failure. But Christ has in fact been raised! So, the reality: Jesus is who he claimed to be—the Son of God, our Lord and Savior. Also his words and promises for us are sure, anchored to the reality of his resurrection. So the reality of the resurrection changes our future and the way we look at life now.

#### TODAY: THE RISEN LORD'S LOVE INSPIRES US TO LOVE OTHERS

From his compassion for the sick and broken, to his sacrificial death on the cross, to the peace he provided after his resurrection, Jesus was the perfect embodiment of love. So we also focus on loving others like Jesus loved us.

With the same supernatural power by which God raised Jesus from the dead, he now enables us to live a new life—one marked by radically selfless love. The motivation and ability to do this comes from seeing the endless love Christ has for us. We love only because he first loved us.

#### **CONFESSION OF SINS**

In today's Gospel, Jesus says that he has chosen us and appointed us to go and bear fruit. He makes it clear what kind of fruit he wants us to bear: "This is my command: Love one another." We know what we are supposed to do, yet, because our sinful nature is selfish and demanding, that fruit is often lacking. This we can openly admit to God because he invites us to confess our sin to him and trust in him to forgive us.

Heavenly Father, we have not always obeyed your commands. We have sinned against you by loving other people and things more than you, and by loving ourselves more than others in our thoughts, words, and deeds. We are sorry. Have mercy on us. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

#### **ABSOLUTION**

Jesus says, "No one has greater love than this: that someone lays down his life for his friends." In his great love, Jesus Christ has laid down his life for us. Though our sins are many, his mercy is more. Jesus died because of our sins and was raised to life because of our justification. I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son + and of the Holy Spirit.

FIRST READING Acts 9:36–42

Tabitha (Dorcas) loved Jesus and helped the poor. Jesus, in love for the people of Joppa, had Peter raise her from death.

<sup>36</sup>In Joppa there was a disciple named Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was always doing good deeds and acts of charity. <sup>37</sup>At that time she became sick and died. After they had washed her, they laid her in an upstairs room. <sup>38</sup>Since Lydda is near Joppa, when the disciples heard that Peter was there, they sent two men to him, who urged him, "Come to us without delay!"

<sup>39</sup>Peter got up and went with them. When he arrived, they led him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing him the robes and clothing that Dorcas made while she was still with them.

<sup>40</sup>After Peter sent them all outside, he got down on his knees and prayed. Then he turned toward the body and said, "Tabitha, get up!" She opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter, she sat up. <sup>41</sup>He gave her his hand and helped her stand up. After he called the saints and the widows, he presented her to them alive.


